
- Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna intends to set up in partnership with Waseda University a Euro-Asia Forum

- Asia is the largest economic region in the world
- But US dollar and euro are the most important currencies
- Trade does not fully reflect this potential

The Euro-Asia Forum

- Two main axes of activity:
 - Economic research
 - Summer School program for young executives (YEP) from Asia in Europe and from Europe in Asia



1. Economic research

- Fostering better understanding of developments in Asia and Europe
- Research project on global imbalances
 - What is the potential for international cooperation between the Euro Area, Japan, China and the United States?
- Sharing the European experience of monetary integration in the context of rapidly increasing regional trade.



2. Summer School Program for Young Executives (YEP)

- young emerging leaders from Japan learn how Europe works.
- young emerging leaders from Europe learn to understand Asia.
- form their own views about potential opportunities in Euro-Asian cooperation.
 - from business community
 - from government administrations



- The European part of Summer School will take part in S. Anna's location in Volterra (Toscana)
- Core lectures and seminars in Europe include:
 - European Integration
 - European **Economy** and its Governance
 - European Jurisprudence,
 - Italian History and Italian Culture



The second part will be dedicated to visiting:

- European Institutions in Brussels
- European Central Bank in Frankfurt
- Italian cultural centres
- Cooperation with Venice University
